

# Rodney to give a war talk

**THE Manchester Jewish Museum will host a day of activities and events on Sunday to mark the centenary of the British Jewry Book of Honour.**

Published in 1922, the 1,000-plus page volume, which contains some 50,000 records of Jews who served in the armed forces during the First World War was the result of meticulous research by Rev Michael Adler, the-then Jewish chaplain of the British army.

On Sunday (11am), We Were There Too project manager Rodney Ross will give a

talk and curator Alex Cropper has dug out some First World War objects from the museum's collection.

Volunteer Lionel Levy will help visitors explore their family stories within the book.

And the museum will also host a family-friendly games workshop, where children will use their best detective skills to work as a team to complete puzzles and creative activities to piece together the lives of Jewish individuals connected to the First World War.
